DETAILS OF GOD'S WORD/WILL - Part 2 (OFTEN DISREGARDED)

A previous message (Rom. 6:5-6) "For since we have become one with Him by sharing in His death, we shall also be one with Him by sharing in His resurrection. This we know--that our old self was nailed to the cross with Him, in order that our sinful nature might be deprived of its power, so that we should no longer be the slaves of sin;"

That Promise is God's <u>reward</u> for those <u>believing on</u> the power of Jesus' sacrifice of Atonement and His resurrection to Life. God wants a person to be free from a human desire to sin. However, if we do <u>not</u> believe on, and do not accept the benefits of Jesus' Atonement work on a cross for us; <u>if</u> we <u>do not</u> <u>believe</u> to <u>receive</u> that actual <u>righteousness</u> which <u>it</u> has provided;... <u>if</u> we <u>do not</u> (<u>because of our unbelief</u>) receive good health provided by the Atonement work of Christ; <u>if</u> <u>we do not</u> (through <u>our unbelief</u>) receive the power to <u>obey God's Word</u> to <u>trust Him financially</u> (instead of depending on a human source of income),...then the Atonement work of Christ <u>has</u> become of no use to us.

Opposite to <u>facts</u> (given in God's <u>Word</u>), there are large numbers of people who <u>say they</u> <u>believe</u> in the Atonement of Jesus Christ, and who think they will get to Heaven because Jesus died for them. However, there are thousands (or millions) of people who are <u>not</u> going to get to Heaven because of their <u>unbelief</u> (even though Jesus Christ did indeed die for them). His Atonement sacrifice does not take anyone to Heaven who does not <u>believe</u> on its power, and so, <u>accept</u> it <u>to receive the benefits</u> of that work of Atonement for us). (Matt.7:19) "Every tree that <u>does not</u> bear good fruit is <u>cut down</u> and <u>thrown into the fire</u>."

<u>Jesus warned</u> about <u>unrepentant sin</u> and <u>unbelief</u> (Luke 13:5) "if <u>you</u> do <u>not repent</u> you will all <u>perish</u> just as they did." Trusting on human things <u>instead of</u> trusting on the divine power of Jesus Christ's <u>work of Atonement</u>, is (in reality) <u>forsaking</u> the <u>mercy</u> God extends to those who <u>will</u> believe on Jesus' sacrifice of Atonement.

Paul explained that <u>sins of the flesh</u>, <u>and</u> 'sin of <u>unbelief</u>' is '<u>idolatry</u>' (just the same as sins of coveting or '<u>greed</u>' are <u>a form</u> of <u>idolatry</u>). God <u>promises</u> that <u>He</u> will <u>take away</u> covetousness and other desires of <u>discontentment</u> from our heart, (and that He will <u>provide</u> for tomorrow and the future through <u>our faith</u> on <u>His Word</u>).

Apostle Paul was inspired to instruct 'believers' (Colos.3:5-6), "put to death your <u>earthly</u> inclinations", "<u>unholy</u> desires", and <u>"all greed</u>, for that is a form of '<u>idolatry</u>'. It <u>is</u> on account of <u>these</u> very sins that God's anger is coming."

In reality, we have <u>no excuse</u> for <u>not believing</u> nor <u>obeying</u> the details of God's Word, <u>because</u> all the <u>power to obey</u> and <u>do</u> His will in our life <u>was provided for us</u> through that Atonement work of Jesus Christ. That is <u>not</u> a religion of <u>law</u> or of <u>works,...but</u>, it <u>is</u> however, the '<u>true</u> Gospel' of trusting <u>faith</u> in Jesus Christ (God's New Covenant Plan). Under the <u>old law</u> people were required to obey God by <u>their own</u> ability (which <u>was</u> a '<u>religion of</u> works', and unfortunately mankind hopelessly <u>failed</u> in his own strength).

Obedience to God's Will under New Testament 'Gospel Plan' (provided by the Atonement of Jesus Christ), is all the more strict, but it is not to be done in our own strength. Rather, it is to be obeyed through the power of the Holy Spirit. In the strength of the Holy Spirit of God (given to true 'believers'), we can succeed in obeying God's Will. That is a major difference between the old law and God's New Covenant Plan.

God's plan can be summed up in two commandments (Matt.22:37-39) "`Thou shalt love the Lord thy God,' `with thy whole heart', 'thy whole soul', 'thy whole mind'.' This is the greatest and foremost Commandment. And the second is similar to that: `Thou shalt love thy fellow man as much as thyself'."

That is <u>basic Truth</u>; and God's <u>Word</u> explains <u>details</u> of <u>His will</u>, for a person wanting to live a true Christian 'life of faith' <u>in God</u>. These two commandments are the <u>basis</u> of God's will, but many branches extend out from those <u>commands</u>, which <u>give us directions</u> to cover the <u>details</u> of <u>our life of faith</u> on <u>God</u>. (1 Pet. 2:13-14) "<u>Submit</u>, for the Lord's sake, to <u>every authority</u> set up by man, whether it be to the Emperor as supreme ruler, or to provincial Governors as sent by him for the punishment of evil-doers, and for the encouragement of those who <u>do what is right</u>."

That includes Government, magistrates, Governors, police officers, husbands, employers, and others appointed to positions of authority. However, when their commands (or directives) conflict with the will of God, we are to disobey them at the cost of our life(as the three Hebrews described in Daniel's book). They refused to bow down to an idol, nor would they obey a manmade plan to 'trust in' someone or something (in place of trusting on God). When they took their stand (at the risk of their life) to disobey the law and plans of men (outside of and against God's will),... God delivered them miraculously.

A <u>husband and wife</u> should be in Scriptural agreement on <u>all matters</u> in the home-life and <u>other</u> things, and with the Holy Spirit's help they will come to <u>Scriptural</u> decisions, not uninformed, <u>impulsive</u>, or <u>inconsistent</u> decisions. When a husband asks a wife to <u>do something</u> (contrary to God's will), if it would cost her <u>life</u>, she should <u>not</u> do it. It is the same with parents and children, we do not do something just to please our children (if it would conflict with the Word and Will of

<u>God</u>). [When we need to make a decision to stay within God's Word and Will, we must realize that God will control the heart and attitude of the other person toward us. We will not have to lose the respect and friendship of other people when we put God's Will first in life.]

(Another <u>detail</u> of God's Will (given by <u>apostle Paul</u> (1 Thess. 5:) "And we ask you brethren, to know those laboring among you, and leading you in the Lord, and admonishing you, and to esteem them very abundantly in love, because of their work; be at peace among yourselves;". [Have peace with <u>God's Will</u>, <u>not question</u> it.]

There are Churches, <u>however</u>, where a Pastor may give advice <u>contrary</u> to <u>God's Word</u>, but the member has no <u>Scriptural right</u> to <u>disobey God</u> and go against His will. When it comes to the plain written <u>Word of God</u>, a member must <u>obey the Word</u> and not follow wrong advice.

The late Pastor referred to the illustration given (Rev.2), where it seemed to be the minister's wife teaching people that it was no harm to commit fornication (secret sins), (to be unfaithful to spouses, and to make sacrifices to idols). Some people obeyed her and disobeyed God. But the 'Son of God' said He was going to kill her children, a terrible sickness would come over her, and those who committed sin with her, were to go through very severe trial. If those people would have obeyed God by putting God's Word first in their life, they would not have fallen into that snare of the devil (and they would have been protected from the horrible fate that would come upon them).

From this warning that Jesus gave the Thyateira Church, <u>we can see</u> that <u>idols</u> and <u>false</u> <u>places of trust come</u> in <u>many deceitful forms</u>. However, <u>anything</u> that <u>means more to us, than</u> for us to <u>stay in</u> the 'Will of God', will then <u>become detrimental to our spirituality</u> and <u>eternal interests</u> (if it is <u>not repented</u> of).

Jesus said (vs.21-23) "I have given her time to repent, but she is determined not to repent of her fornication. I tell you that I am about to cast her upon a bed of sickness, and I will severely afflict those who commit adultery with her, unless they repent of conduct such as hers. Her children too shall surely die; and all the Churches shall come to know that I am He who searches into men's inmost thoughts; and to each of you I will give a requital which shall be in accordance with 'what your conduct' has been." [Could there be a more direct refute (coming from Jesus Christ, Himself) about a person taking a position of 'once saved, always saved'?]

In the <u>next</u> verse, Jesus gave <u>His promise</u> for <u>those who do put God's Will</u> and <u>Word first</u> in <u>their life</u> (24) "But to you, the rest of you in Thyateira, all who do <u>not</u> hold this teaching and are <u>not</u> <u>the people</u> who have learnt the "deep things," as they call them (deep things of <u>Satan!</u>) to <u>you</u> I <u>say</u> that I lay no other burden on you."

Jesus <u>adds</u> 'a <u>condition</u>' ₂₅ "Only that which you already possess, <u>cling to until</u> I come." Meaning, to '<u>overcome</u>' in faith and righteousness to the end for He said ₂₆ "And to him <u>who overcomes</u> and <u>obeys</u> My commands to the <u>very end</u>, I will give authority over the nations of the earth." We are to <u>be</u> absolutely <u>pure and clean</u> in marital relations. A man is not to look in lust at a woman. Jesus also said, a person's <u>daily prayer is</u> that we be <u>not led into</u> '<u>temptation'</u>.

A <u>detail</u> in God's Word many times overlooked and <u>not taught</u> in Churches, <u>is</u> that God does not expect us to remain <u>pure</u> by <u>our</u> own <u>strength</u>. It is <u>through sincere commitment</u> on our part to act in obedient faith on Him, that <u>we are</u> to <u>be kept pure by God's power</u>. (1Pet. 1:5) <u>you</u> "who are <u>kept</u> by the power of God <u>through faith</u> for salvation."

Another detail of God's will to consider is a relationship between children and their parents. The key to having obedience and peace in the home, is that the parents must take the place that God assigned them (toward each other and toward their children). If parents will do that, God will see to it that the children take their place of full obedience.

It <u>is</u> the <u>parents' relationship</u> with <u>God</u> (<u>depending on Him</u> to <u>control their children</u>, and to show them how to discipline in a Christlike way). That is what allows God to control the children.

We shouldn't expect our children to obey us via our threats, hard looks, and mean or threatening words,...(which are <u>all efforts</u> and methods of the <u>self-life</u> still within our heart). Ephes. 6:4 "<u>do not irritate</u> your children, but, bring them up tenderly with <u>true Christian training</u> and <u>advice</u>."

Hebr. 12:6 "for those whom the Lord loves He disciplines:" (and that would mean with caring, divine love, because that is God's nature). (Vs.7) "God is dealing with you, as sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline?" (We must give God opportunity to teach us how to train our children as He promised.)

Another detail to consider is the matter of staying Scriptural on <u>fellowship</u>. The general <u>rule</u> of <u>God's Word</u> for right <u>fellowship</u> is found (2 Cor.14) "Do not come into <u>close association</u> with unbelievers,". (Close ongoing association <u>is</u> '<u>fellowship'</u>).

An <u>un</u>believer would <u>mean</u> anyone who is <u>not</u> a <u>true believer</u>, (A <u>believer in</u> the <u>full Gospel Message</u> of <u>Jesus Christ</u>). Jesus said "by their fruits you will know them" (Matt. 7:20). There are at least three qualifications which define a 'true believer'.

The <u>first</u> is that a person has confessed and forsaken their sins; <u>second</u>, that they have surrendered their lives to God and have been filled with His Holy Spirit; and <u>third</u>, that they are <u>walking in full obedience to</u> the written Word of God in the New Testament (in <u>all</u> the <u>details</u> of their life). (In other words), a person must be <u>obeying God's Word spiritually</u> by making <u>Scriptural</u> decisions regarding the healing of their body, in their finances, home-life, and other things.

There are many true believers who at first, may not be obeying the Bible in all the details of life (the late Pastor said). They are only 'babes in Christ'... and do not know all the Bible; nor do they <u>understand how to divide</u> the <u>Word of Truth</u> in all situations; but in their hearts they are <u>willing</u>; (which means, they have taken a position of full <u>surrender</u> to obey God's Word where it is made plain to them. (<u>That</u> is <u>the attitude</u> that <u>God wants to see</u>).

The moment that a person <u>knowingly</u> and deliberately <u>opposes</u> one Truth of the Bible, and <u>refuses to walk in spiritual light</u> in regard to <u>healing</u>, in their <u>finances</u>, the <u>home</u>, or they use <u>self-efforts</u> in Christian or any type of work...at that moment they <u>cease</u> to <u>be</u> a <u>true believer</u> in the <u>true Bible sense</u>. One may <u>think</u> that is a very narrow viewpoint, but, <u>there are Scriptures</u> to prove it.

The <u>meaning</u> of 'fellowship' is to be in <u>close association</u> with someone; to have people come into <u>our home</u> and <u>we</u> go into <u>theirs</u>; or to be a member of a club (almost always along with <u>unbelievers</u> of whom Scripture tells us to "come out from among them"), or it means belong to an organization (such as a Church, a lodge, or a union). It is directly against the will of God to belong to an organization that does not teach nor practice the <u>full Truth</u>. Apostle Paul illustrated that Acts 18:4-5 "But, Sabbath after Sabbath, he preached in the synagogue and tried to win over both Jews and Greeks. Now at the time when Silas and Timothy came down from Macedonia, Paul (compelled by the Spirit)"was preaching fervently, and solemnly telling the Jews that Jesus <u>is the Christ</u>."

Some people will say, "everybody accepts Jesus as the Christ." "but do they really?" "I say, 'NO' (the Pastor said). The moment a person accepts a Christ who is not the same Christ today (as He was in Bible times),.."do they truly accept Christ?" When they say that "Jesus Christ has changed", we should ask, do they have any Christ at all?" Some people say that God (in Heaven) will not hear nor answer prayer (on earth) anymore. People who have a Christ such as that in their life, will never receive any answer to prayer. And, we should ask ourselves (in all sincerity), "do they in reality have any Christ in their life?" Paul did not think so!!, and his 'spiritual anger' was revealed with his protest of their actions and their words spoken in blatant 'unbelief'—it was the sin of 'idolatry'. *(Unfortunately) many people today have received "another Jesus" and "another gospel", and sad to say, "they put up with it" (Paul explained).

(Acts 18:6 states), "But upon their <u>opposing him</u> with abusive (blasphemous) language, he shook his clothes by way of protest, and said to them, "Your <u>ruin will be upon your own heads</u>. I am <u>not responsible</u>: in future I will go among <u>the Gentiles</u>."

Jesus sent twelve disciples out with instructions (Mark 6:11) "And whoever will <u>not receive</u> <u>you</u> (nor <u>hear you</u>), when you depart from there, 'shake off the dust under your feet' as a testimony <u>against them.</u>"

People will often say "I <u>never rejected</u> Christ (<u>nor</u> the Atonement)." However, the <u>truth</u> of the matter <u>is</u>, people have <u>no Christ unless He is</u> the <u>Lord</u> and <u>Master of their life;</u> (which <u>is</u> the <u>only thing</u> that <u>counts in the end</u>). The <u>Bible</u> portrays a Christ who <u>forgives</u> all <u>our sins</u> (and <u>delivers us from</u> doctors and drugs); a Christ who <u>satisfies</u> our every <u>need</u> and desire here in <u>this present life</u>. Jesus Christ is <u>not divided</u>; (<u>either 'He' is</u> the '<u>Lord of our life'</u>, <u>or</u> Satan is!) (Rom.6:16) "Do you <u>not know that to whom you present yourselves</u> (our choice) slaves to <u>obey</u>, you <u>are</u> that one's slaves (<u>whom you obey</u>), whether of '<u>sin</u>' (which includes unbelief) <u>leading to death</u>,... <u>or</u>, of '<u>obedience</u>' (which includes '<u>believing</u>') <u>leading</u> to <u>righteousness</u>?"

As <u>soon</u> as those Jews <u>rejected the Message</u> concerning <u>Jesus Christ</u>, Paul <u>immediately</u> <u>left their fellowship</u>. When <u>they refused</u> (to believe in) the <u>same Christ</u> (who <u>walked on this earth</u> and who <u>was raised from</u> the dead); when <u>they rejected</u> an <u>unchanged Christ</u>, ... Paul <u>walked out</u> of the synagogue. (Vs.7) "So he <u>left the place</u> and went to <u>the house</u> of a person called Titius Justus, a <u>worshiper</u> of the <u>'true God'</u>. His house was <u>next door to</u> the <u>synagogue</u>."

When those people rejected the Christ that Paul came to teach them about (they refused to 'believe'), Paul left them and went into a man's house where he could teach the full Truth Gospel,... which he knew was pleasing to God. (Vs.8-9) "And Crispus, the Warden of the synagogue, 'believed' in the Lord, and so did all his household; and from time to time many of the Corinthians who heard Paul believed and received baptism. And in a vision by night, the Lord said to Paul, "Dismiss your fears: go on speaking, and do not give up." (God left that organization when Paul left, and He went with Paul into that house next door).

God will go with us (when we separate ourselves from any group of unbelievers). (The Lord said to Paul, Vs.10-11) "I am with you, and no one shall attack you to injure you; for I have very many people in this city." So, Paul remained in Corinth for a year and six months, teaching among them the Message of God."

How <u>foolish</u> of us to <u>think</u> that <u>we can do</u> what God Himself could not do. Jesus Christ, <u>Himself</u> could not reform those people in that Church (against their will); He <u>had</u> to start a <u>new one</u> where people <u>were willing</u> to <u>believe</u> and <u>obey</u>. Jesus said on one occasion that people <u>did not</u> put new wine into <u>old</u> wineskins, (lest they <u>burst</u> and the wine <u>be lost</u>). The <u>same principle</u> is <u>involved now</u>. If a person wants to live the <u>full Truth</u>, they are to <u>live</u> where <u>it is taught</u> (not in fellowship with <u>unbelievers</u> and those who teach <u>false doctrine</u> or <u>different</u> Christ.

We should take notice of how pleased God was with Paul's attitude to separate from unbelievers. (Vs.11)"Now God worked unusual miracles by the hands of Paul,".(12)"and the diseases left them and the evil spirits went out of them." If there is one thing that pleases God, it is

for us to separate ourselves from unbelievers, (and right on fellowship). 2 cor.6:14 "Be <u>not</u> unequally <u>yoked</u> with <u>unbelievers</u>." (vs 15-16)" Or what part has a believer with an unbeliever?" "And what agreement has the temple of God with idols? For you are the temple of the living God. As God has said: "I will dwell in them, <u>And</u> walk among them. I will be their God, And they shall be My people."

How can anyone who <u>claims</u> to be walking in <u>the light</u> of God's Truth, <u>walk with those who are not?</u>, when <u>their actions prove</u> they are walking in <u>the darkness of unbelief of the power of</u>
Jesus Christ's <u>Atonement sacrifice</u>. (John 8: 12) "I am the light of the world." "He <u>who follows</u> Me shall <u>not walk in darkness</u>, but <u>have</u> the <u>light</u> of <u>life</u>."

"Therefore, "Come out from among them, And be separate, says the Lord. (2 Cor.6:17-18)" Do not touch what is unclean (because of their unbelief), And I will receive you." "I will be a Father to you, And you shall be My sons and daughters, Says the Lord Almighty."

['Lord Almighty' is the strongest of language, for it means 'Jehovah', the 'Everlasting Deliverer' of His people. 'Lord Almighty' said that those who are clean-cut (on keeping Scriptural fellowship), will be His sons and daughters. Can anyone of us fully comprehend the importance of having the gift (and presence) of God, Himself in our life? and to receive all the benefits of the Atonement sacrifice of Jesus Christ (as we prove for ourselves that Jehovah, El Shaddai, is a power that nothing on earth (or in hell) can stand against!]

(These are only <u>some</u> of <u>the details</u> to be <u>learned</u> about <u>God's</u> <u>Will</u>, and Jesus said, "Whoever <u>does the will</u> of my Father in Heaven is my brother, sister, and mother." (Matt:12:50) And (Matt.7:21) "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven."

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S194R MPs: 1... God's Word gives us many details of how to do His Will in our life, and it emphasizes an 'enduring faith' on the power of the 'atonement sacrifice' of Jesus Christ (for a person to receive 'Salvation'). Unfortunately, many people overlook the details, while false teachers tickle their ears with a partial Truth, instead of the full Truth teaching of Jesus Christ.

- 2...<u>Jesus emphasized</u> that <u>obedient faith</u> on God and His Word, <u>proves</u> that our love for Him is <u>genuine</u>, (and that we should have the same true love for our fellow-men).
- 3... And He <u>warned</u> us about the <u>danger</u> of <u>unrepentant sins</u> and <u>unbelief</u>, which <u>is the 'idolatry'</u> of <u>depending</u> on <u>human</u> things, plans, and persons instead of trusting on the <u>divine power</u> of Jesus Christ's atonement work on the Cross.
- 4... Jesus inspired the apostle Paul to give us strict details from His Word, for us to be <u>Scriptural</u> on keeping <u>fellowship</u> with <u>true 'believers'</u> (not with <u>unbelievers</u> who <u>reject</u> the <u>true Christ</u> and God's Message of Salvation), (but they do accept a Christ who is <u>not</u> the same as the <u>true unchanged Christ</u> whom Paul presented for people to accept into their life).
