THE CHRISTIAN LIFE in REALITY

The First-Century Gospel Church

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Every true believer would be most fortunate to truly realize and understand what the "true Christian life" really <u>means</u>. But, professed Christians today "are occupied with a variety of(outward) activities", but, as the Bible predicted, this will all be in vain.

Jesus spoke about <u>outwardly religious</u> people of <u>His</u> day (Matt.15: 8-9), These people draw near to Me with their mouth, And honor Me with <u>their</u> lips, But their heart is far from Me. And <u>in vain</u> they worship Me, Teaching <u>as doctrines</u>, the commandments of men.'"

Their outwardly religious gestures, adornments, other activities of 'self', and pious words, are thoroughly <u>useless</u> (toward living a <u>life</u> of <u>faith</u> and <u>trust</u> on God), which <u>is</u> in essence, the actual <u>true</u> Christian life. To be <u>truthful</u>, all those outward activities are very <u>harmful</u> spiritually (the late Pastor explained(, and they will bring no <u>spiritual blessing</u> whatsoever, because they are inspired by the <u>devil</u> who is in <u>control</u> of the <u>self-life</u>.

It <u>is bad enough</u> to <u>have 'self'</u> and <u>the devil in control of daily affairs</u> in a person's life, and so, make wrong decisions on <u>fellowship matters</u> (to please family members, employers, or others), instead of following God's directions in His Word. Or, to make decisions based on the 'financial aspect' of a situation (the <u>cheapest</u> way out <u>instead of</u> deciding in <u>God's</u> will)... <u>or</u>, to depend on the kind of climate, or what we eat or drink <u>for</u> the '<u>health</u>' of our body. However, as <u>bad as those decisions</u> are, nothing could be worse than to have the devil leading and controlling us under the '<u>cloak</u> of religion' (and we can <u>be sure</u> that the devil fully <u>knows that</u>). The devil will <u>hide</u> behind any <u>outward activities</u> of a self-life that he can devise, which are meant to <u>deceive</u> and make us <u>seem</u> to <u>feel</u> more righteous before God, (<u>instead of</u> us following Christ, having guidance of the unseen Holy Spirit, <u>and</u> receiving <u>real spiritual</u> light as God promised). (John 8:12, Jesus said), "I am the light of the world. He who <u>follows</u> Me shall <u>not</u> '<u>walk in darkness'</u>, but <u>have</u> the '<u>light of life'</u>."

There couldn't be anything <u>more</u> valuable than to allow God to lead, teach, and guide <u>us</u> (as He did with successful Bible characters who allowed Him to guide them) <u>because</u> our <u>eternal life</u> <u>depends</u> on it.

If we <u>allow</u> the devil to deceive us by listening to the many and various misleading <u>opinions</u> of God's Truth from false teachers who tickle the ears of listeners, ... (<u>instead</u> of us <u>heeding to</u> full Truth messages from God's <u>Word</u> and depending on the <u>promised presence</u> of the Holy Spirit to teach and lead us),... then we <u>would</u> actually be <u>placing ourselves</u> on the <u>devil's territory</u> to be <u>deceived</u> by him.

'False teaching' and '<u>outward religion'</u> is far worse and more dangerous and prevalent among '<u>professed'</u> <u>Christians</u> in this present day (if that is possible), because of all those outward activities and gestures which are still controlled by <u>self</u> and <u>Satan</u>, who disguises himself as an 'angel of light'. In most cases those same people are <u>not</u> '<u>trusting</u>' God for any<u>thing</u>, ... or in <u>any part</u> of their life, while at the same time <u>professing</u> to be believing Christians. However, <u>Jesus</u> told us, (Matt. 7:20-21) "So by <u>their</u> <u>fruits</u> at any rate, you will easily <u>recognize</u> them. Not everyone who <u>says</u> to Me, `Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who <u>does the will</u> of My <u>Father</u> in <u>heaven</u>."

Jesus spoke very <u>plainly</u> about the multitudes of 'professed Christians' in the world (then and now), (Matt.7:22-23) "Many will say to me on that day, "`Master, Master, have we not prophesied in Thy name, and in Thy name expelled demons, and in Thy name performed many mighty works?' "And then I will tell them <u>plainly</u>, "`I never knew you: begone from me, you doers of wickedness.' (Outwardly religious professed Christians that Jesus spoke about, had failed to <u>put His teachings into practice</u> by

trusting on <u>Him</u> for things in their life. So He called them <u>doers of wickedness</u> and told them "<u>begone</u> from Me".

We <u>must</u> have the <u>sin of Adam</u> reversed in our life, and, return to trusting (depending) on God, instead of on <u>'self'</u>. That is being born again of the Spirit, <u>Who</u> will teach us to always trust on the 'One whom God has sent'. Jesus said (Luke 18:17), "I tell you in <u>solemn truth</u> that, whoever <u>does not</u> receive the <u>Kingdom of God</u> like a little <u>child</u>, will <u>certainly not enter it.</u>"

Referring, however, to those who take His Words to heart and who "do the will of God", by <u>putting His Words into practice</u> in <u>their life</u> (He said Matt.7:24) "Everyone who hears these my teachings and <u>acts upon them</u> will be found to resemble a wise man who builds his house upon rock;". Which means that <u>God</u> will <u>protect</u> those who <u>believe His Word</u> and whose trust is "on the One whom He has sent', … and so, <u>protect</u> them <u>from</u> being <u>deceived</u> by false teachers and other agents of Satan, who are deceiving people to <u>rely</u> on <u>false</u> places of trust and <u>outward activities</u> of <u>self</u> to try to obtain <u>righteousness</u> which God's Spirit will bestow on those who <u>believe</u> His Word and <u>trust</u> on Him.

<u>Wasting time</u> on religious <u>gestures</u> which make one <u>seem</u> to 'feel more righteous', will only <u>hinder</u> a person from <u>understanding</u> the real meaning of what Jesus has already <u>accomplished</u> for them on the Cross (and throws God's offers of mercy to the winds). Outward religious activities hinder a person from making a <u>commitment toward</u> 'obedient faith' in God, ... and to be led and <u>taught by His</u> <u>Spirit</u> to 'do <u>His</u> will' in <u>their</u> life, ...<u>because</u> they <u>become</u> <u>deceived</u> to <u>think their own</u> <u>efforts</u> will <u>make</u> <u>them more righteous</u> (but, instead, leads to compromises of faith on God). (Hebr.10:38) "But it <u>is by</u> <u>faith</u> that My righteous servant shall live;". <u>That is the right</u> and <u>only</u> road <u>back to God</u>, and toward reversing the sin of Adam in our life.

The apostle Paul <u>referred</u> to religious or <u>ceremonial customs</u> of a <u>self-life</u>, and the outward religious <u>practice</u> of <u>circumcision</u> (because that was prevalent with professed Christians at that time)(1 Cor.7:19) "Circumcision is nothing, and un-circumcision is nothing; <u>obedience</u> to God's commandments is <u>everything</u>."

Apostle Paul could see that their outward religion was a <u>hindrance</u> to their having <u>real</u> faith in God, and that it was "all in <u>vain</u>" as Jesus said. It was inspired and controlled by the devil" (to prevent a person from getting on the <u>right road back to God</u> by <u>reversing</u> the wrong steps that Adam had taken.

When we see professed Christians, <u>saying</u> "Lord, Lord", and taking part in many types of <u>'outward forms'</u> of religion, but we <u>do not</u> see (or recognize) "the fruits of the Spirit" (<u>Jesus</u> said that we <u>should</u> see),.. then we are seeing "a <u>people</u> who <u>honor</u> me with their <u>lips</u>", but <u>not</u> in <u>their hearts</u> (as He explained).

However, <u>if</u> anyone gives their life to God <u>right</u>, holds steadfast in their faith and committed to do His Will, and accepts <u>Him</u> as their <u>teacher</u>, God will eliminate all that <u>false activity</u> and <u>wasted time</u> (in their <u>spiritual life</u>). As quickly as possible, God will bring a person to understand <u>what</u> is really <u>essential</u>, <u>necessary</u>, and <u>worthwhile</u> in the Christian's 'life of faith', and they will begin to <u>act</u> much <u>different</u> from the way of <u>professed</u> Christians of the world.

When a person gives their life to God right, He will enable them to compare professed Christians of today, with professed Christians in the Bible. God will enable a <u>surrendered person</u> to soon realize the great <u>difference</u> between <u>those</u> who just <u>say they believe</u>, and <u>true believers</u> in the Bible, and He will enable them to <u>live</u> like Bible Christians did." They will be <u>taught</u> and <u>led</u> by the <u>Spirit</u> to live the <u>'humble'</u> life, (be <u>committed</u> to <u>doing</u> God's will, instead of the will of the self-life), and, to enjoy living <u>victorious</u> life of trust on God (just as Jesus did). That is the <u>goal</u> and object of <u>all</u> of <u>God's dealings with</u> <u>us</u>, to <u>restore us to</u> the <u>Christian character</u> that He first created,.. restore us to the <u>image</u> of God, the <u>righteousness</u> of God, the <u>humility</u> of God, and to everything else that <u>is God-like</u>. And, the most

valuable thing of all, is to have the 'love of God' within our heart(which should be the primary goal of every Christian).

"The <u>way back</u> to that <u>goal</u> is not via <u>outward religious activity</u> which only hinders us (and that the devil uses to deceive and make one <u>feel like</u> a Christian). The <u>way back</u> to that goal is what God enables <u>us</u> to learn, to <u>know</u>, and <u>understand from</u> His <u>Word</u> and <u>by</u> His Spirit, (and God alone could receive <u>all glory</u> for that).

"The <u>first</u> thing God wants us to learn on our <u>road back</u> to obedience to Him, is to <u>depend on Him</u> for <u>everything</u> that pertains to 'this <u>present life'</u>,.. <u>not</u> on many plans the <u>world</u> has devised. No person or thing that we could or would depend on (other than God) is worthwhile. Spending time on outward religious acts or activities are only <u>used by Satan</u> to <u>deceive</u> a person (the Pastor said). "It would only be 'wasted time' in a true Christian's life, for one to do so."

"True Christians in the Bible learned to trust <u>God</u> for the things in their life. An outstanding example of the <u>results</u> of fully <u>trusting</u> on God, is that of the three Hebrews (Daniel 3rd.chapter. It shows us what God <u>can</u> and <u>will do</u> for anyone else who will put their <u>faith</u> in Him as they did. God can bring every human being to that same '<u>place</u> of <u>trust</u>', to where there is nothing else one can do for themselves, and nowhere else to turn but to <u>God</u>. We just have to give <u>God</u> a <u>chance</u> to <u>help</u> us, by turning <u>our trust</u> and <u>dependance</u> back to <u>Him</u>.

"However, <u>if people continue</u> to <u>shut God out of their lives</u>, by continuing to follow <u>man's</u> teaching, advice, and opinions controlled by the devil,...<u>instead of being taught by God</u> through living a <u>'life</u> of <u>trust'</u> and learning from Him by experience, they will <u>never learn</u> to <u>trust God</u> for <u>anything</u>. The <u>'light'</u> of the world is Jesus (we are told John 8:12). However, with the <u>devil</u> in control of one's life, it would be <u>impossible</u> to trust anybody <u>but</u> man.

The result of <u>God's</u> teaching and workmanship, can be seen by the <u>stand</u> those three Hebrews <u>took</u>, when they <u>refused</u> to bend their backs to the emperor's golden image, or to even make a <u>fake</u> <u>gesture</u> of trust in that image set up by man (by just <u>acting</u> like they were trusting in the king's golden image in order to save their life), when they were professing trust on God. They knew that burning to death instantly was to be their punishment, but <u>still they refused</u> to <u>bow</u>, and they <u>stood for</u> what was <u>right</u> and <u>Scriptural</u>. Any person who had not surrendered 'self' from their life, and, had not been <u>taught</u> by the Spirit of God, could not have taken such a <u>stand of faith</u> and <u>trust</u> in God.

Those men proved <u>by</u> their <u>decision</u> and <u>actions</u>, that their <u>surrender</u> was <u>final</u>, to depend on God for everything in their life. They were not going to <u>compromise</u> on <u>where</u> their 'place of <u>trust'</u> would be (by signing on with the king's order), no matter <u>how severe</u> the circumstances or penalties were. They were not just '<u>saying</u>' "Lord, Lord",... <u>nor</u>, were they only "<u>honoring</u> God with their <u>lips</u>, while their <u>hearts</u> were <u>far away</u>" from Him. (They were <u>surrendering all</u> to <u>God</u>!).

They would not join in with the crowd of unbelievers, who were 'signing on' with the emperor's policy, by <u>bowing</u> to the <u>rules</u> he had set up to trust in his policy, instead of placing their '<u>trust</u>' in <u>God</u> <u>alone</u>. They would not even be <u>part</u> of such a gesture of 'false trust', by following the multitudes on the <u>easy</u> and <u>wide path</u> (even if it <u>meant</u> their <u>life</u>)(which it did humanly speaking).

Those Hebrew children are an <u>example</u> of what <u>we</u> will do, <u>when we</u> are under God's teaching and workmanship" and being guided by His Spirit. It is the <u>attitude</u> that God will bring <u>His</u> people to take, when <u>faced</u> with making a S<u>criptural</u> decision). God will enable us to also be <u>un</u>-compromising in <u>where</u> our 'place of trust' should <u>be and remain</u>. God is no respecter of persons, so He will bring every true child of His to that <u>same</u> place (which is <u>necessary</u> to <u>test our faith</u>) <u>if we</u> will take the same uncompromising '<u>position</u> of <u>trust</u>' that those three Hebrews took. (They were <u>tested</u>, and they <u>proved</u> that their <u>surrender</u> of the 'self-life' was <u>final</u>, their <u>commitment</u> to trust in God was genuine, and their <u>place of trust uncompromising</u>). It was <u>real faith</u>, <u>not</u> an <u>'outward gesture'</u>. Therefore, God worked a miracle for them when the king had them thrown into the fiery furnace, as the fire could not even singe their hair. (Dan.3:24-25) "King Nebuchadnezzar was astonished; and he rose in haste and spoke, saying to his counselors, "I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire; and they are <u>not hurt</u>, and the <u>form</u> of the fourth is like the <u>Son of God</u>." The king and his counselors "saw these men on whose bodies the fire had no power; the hair of their head was not singed nor were their garments affected, and the <u>smell of fire was not</u> on them."

The miracle of protection they received from God, was the <u>result</u> of <u>His</u> teaching and workmanship in their lives, <u>after</u> they had <u>truly surrendered</u> the 'self-life' to do God's will in their life. And, it is an illustration of what kind of a God we serve, how <u>safe it is</u> to <u>trust Him</u>, and how <u>sure we can</u> <u>be</u> to believe His Word for <u>our victory</u>.

The <u>example</u> of King Jehoshaphat is also remarkable. He had given his life to God, but he had not yet learned to trust God for every-thing in his life. <u>Only God</u> can teach us that, when He finds us <u>ready</u> to learn the lessons. No doubt, Jehoshaphat <u>had had</u> other battles and tests to meet in his life, and had proven God's faithfulness in other ways, but he still had more tests to meet, to learn how to deal personally and successfully with God. We could never learn nor understand too much <u>about how God</u> <u>had to test Jehoshaphat</u> to prove his faith, and we could never <u>refer to his example too often</u>, because that is the way God has to deal with us to test our faith.

Jehoshaphat had repented, given his life to God, settled it to trust God according to His Word, and everything <u>seemed to be going well</u>. But, <u>if</u> we <u>never had a battle</u> to <u>meet</u>, we would <u>never learn</u> <u>anything</u> in the Christian 'life of faith'. Human <u>prosperity without</u> any '<u>financial battles'</u>, is one of the most <u>dangerous</u> and <u>destructive</u> things there could be to <u>our spiritual life</u>. For a person to make progress in the Truth, <u>circumstances must arise</u> that will <u>require us</u> to <u>make a decision in favor of God or</u> man (and they could arise many times a day). (1 Pet.1:6-7 we are told to "Rejoice triumphantly in the prospect of this, even if now, for a short time, you are compelled to sorrow amid various trials. The sorrow comes in order that the testing of your faith... being more precious than that of gold, which perishes and yet is proved by fire... may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the re-appearing of Jesus Christ."

In most Churches of the world, you will not get an inkling of the teaching that the road to eternal life is through the battles and trials we go through to <u>see if we meet them right</u>. God could see that <u>Jehoshaphat needed to have his faith developed</u>, and God allowed three armies to come against him, which put great fear in him. He knew that God was the only one who could save him and the Israelites, so he called for a fasting and prayer meeting with the people of Judah. Jehoshaphat's prayer was a <u>model for us</u>, as he spoke the whole truth of their situation to God (but he first got his eyes on God's power), before he mentioned his troubles to God). He prayed (2 Chron.20:6), "O Lord God of our fathers, are You not God in heaven, and do You not rule over all the kingdoms of the nations, and in Your hand is there not power and might, so that no one is able to withstand You?"

What an inspiration of <u>faith</u>! It <u>is</u> a <u>fact</u> that <u>when we look at ourselves</u> and <u>our troubles</u>, we are filled with <u>doubt</u> and <u>despair</u>, but one sincere look at God and His Word will fill us with quietness and confidence. So, as Jehoshaphat got his eyes on God's power, he began to be inspired with confidence, and he <u>claimed</u> their right to have what God had given them. He then prayed, did you not say (vs.9) that if "we will stand before this temple and in Your presence (for Your Name is in this temple), and (we) <u>cry</u> <u>out to You in our affliction</u>, and <u>You will hear and save</u>.¹⁷

What a combination of <u>prayer for victory</u>, as he <u>claimed</u> that <u>promise of God</u> in <u>prayer</u>, and <u>believing</u> that God could not go back on His promise. <u>Then</u> Jehoshaphat told God his troubles (vs.10-12), "And now, here are the people of Ammon, Moab, and Mount Seir--whom You would not let Israel invade when they came out of the land of Egypt, but they turned from them and did not destroy them--

"here they are, rewarding us by coming to throw us out of Your possession which You have given us to inherit. "O our God, will You not judge them? For we have no power against this great multitude that is coming against us; nor do we know what to do, but our eyes are upon You."

A helpless person is the kind that God can help, <u>because they have parted company with</u> <u>depending on self</u> and <u>the devil</u>, and, have no where else to turn to other than God. What an <u>example of</u> <u>prayer</u> "nor do we know what to do, <u>but our eyes are upon You</u>." ... to <u>show us how we</u> can have the devil's power defeated and connect us up with <u>God's omnipotent power</u> and <u>authority over Heaven</u> and <u>earth</u> (and a power that is always with us and at our disposal).

When Jehoshaphat prayed "<u>but our eyes</u> are upon You." (and he believed), God answered instantly, (vs.14-17) "Then the Spirit of the Lord came upon Jahaziel the son of Zechariah (a Levite in the midst of the assembly), And he said, "Listen, all you of Judah and you inhabitants of Jerusalem, and you, King Jehoshaphat ! Thus <u>says the Lord to you</u>: `Do <u>not be afraid nor dismayed</u> because of this great multitude, for <u>the battle is not yours</u>, <u>but God's</u>. `Tomorrow go down against them. `You <u>will not need</u> to fight in this <u>battle</u>. Position yourselves, stand still and <u>see the salvation of the Lord</u>, who is <u>with you</u>, O Judah and Jerusalem!' Do not fear or be dismayed; tomorrow go out against them, for <u>the Lord is with</u> <u>you</u>." He told the problem to God, believed His promise to deliver and the battle was won instantly.

When <u>we</u> also <u>fully</u> surrender to <u>do</u> God's will in our life, and when we realize <u>what kind</u> of a <u>God</u> we <u>have</u> (<u>like</u> the three Hebrews and Jehoshaphat <u>did</u> under His teaching and training), God will enable us to be <u>uncompromising</u> in <u>our</u> life of faith and trust (and to make right <u>decisions</u> in our life).

When people continue to <u>shut God out</u> of their lives, and accept <u>wrong</u> teaching <u>from man</u> (<u>or</u> <u>straight from the devil</u>), they will never <u>learn</u> to '<u>trust</u>' <u>God</u> for 'anything'". As noted before, for one "to <u>understand</u> what the "true Christian life" <u>really means</u>, is something every true believer would be most <u>fortunate</u> to <u>come</u> to <u>realize</u>," (instead of being occupied with <u>outward</u> 'religious gestures' under the '<u>cloak</u> of religion', which will <u>all</u> be 'in <u>vain'</u>, (<u>Jesus said</u>).

Actually <u>living</u> by <u>faith</u> in God's Word,... <u>is</u> the <u>true</u> <u>'Christian life'</u> in reality. &&&&&

"THE ACTUAL TRUE CHRISTIAN LIFE"... SOME MAIN POINTS ARE:

1... How fortunate are true believers to be enabled to realize that outward religious gestures and activities, have no value whatever, <u>spiritually</u>..but they are a product of the <u>self-life</u> and used by Satan to be a <u>hindrance</u> to a true Christian keeping their eyes on God alone.

2... As bad as it is to have 'self' and the devil in control of our decisions in <u>daily</u> life situations, nothing could be worse than to have the devil leading us under the '<u>cloak</u> of religion' (and the devil <u>knows that</u>). He will <u>hide</u> behind any <u>outward activities</u> of a self-life that he can devise for us to carry out, which are used to <u>deceive</u> us, and make us <u>seem</u> to <u>feel</u> more righteous before God.

3... How fortunate a person is to come to the place where they understand that <u>living</u> a 'life of genuine faith and trust' in God, ... <u>is</u> the only '<u>true</u> Christian life'.

4... The devil <u>deceives</u> people into <u>compromising</u> their trust on God. The example of King Jehoshaphat's <u>severe test</u> from God is used in the message, to emphasize that <u>when</u> one <u>is taught</u> and <u>led</u> by <u>God's</u> <u>Spirit</u> (as He was) they will not <u>compromise where</u> their place of trust should be (and <u>remain</u>), no matter how hard the <u>test</u> or <u>consequences</u> may <u>seem</u> to await a person,... for God is faithful to provide, protect, and avenge in reaponse to uncompromising faith on Him.
