Reaching a Critical Time!

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When a game reaches the last few minutes of play—there is *not much time left*—so intensity and focus increase. How much more, then, since the world has reached a *critical stage*, should we say: There is *not much time left!* We need to concentrate intensely on God's *Word* and focus all our attention on living the *Truth* He has given.

Two thousand years ago the words were written Romans 13:12 "The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light. 13 Let us walk honestly, as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering [merciless; cruel] and wantonness [lacking restraint or control], not in strife and envying."

The night is now much *more* spent—so there is *not much time* for God to prepare us—changing our attitudes from what they *were* to what they must *be*—to be *ready* for His return. The apostle wanted to be with *Jesus*, but if God wanted him to remain on *earth*, he would live every day in a way that would help others live that Truth—before time ran out. He wrote Romans 13:14 "Put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfil the lusts thereof."

He told the Philippians Philippians 1:9 "And this I pray, that your love may abound yet more and more in knowledge and in all judgment; 10 That ye may approve things that are excellent; that ye may be sincere and without offence till the day of Christ." Our love for others must abound yet more and more by having a forgiving spirit toward all.

We should *know* what is excellent; be *sincere* for the Word; and to walk by faith in God until *the* day of Christ so as to be ready. Philippians 1:11 "Being filled with the fruits of righteousness, which are by Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God." Bearing spiritual *fruit*, is meeting spiritual *lessons*—and responding to them scripturally!

The apostle knew how God wanted him to conduct his life, so he said Philippians 1:21 "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. 22 But if I live in the flesh, this is the fruit of my labour: yet what I shall choose I wot not. 23 For I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better: 24 Nevertheless to abide in the flesh is more needful for you."

Jesus told his disciples to proclaim the gospel to everyone; Mark 16:15 "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. 16 He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned."

Anyone who really believes in the Lord Jesus and what He accomplished on the Cross for them, would ask to be baptized. Those who did *not* believe in Jesus and would *not* obey the Gospel, would *not* ask to be baptized—and would eventually land in the Lake of Fire—unless they repent.

Disobeying a military commander is called *insubordination*; disobeying the captain of a ship is called *mutiny*; so disobeying the Savior would have to be called *rebellion*, *betrayal*, and *treason*.

When we *believe* what God says, and that we will give an *account* of our life to Him—and

maybe sooner than later—we will *live* His Truth more zealously; we would be really *concerned* for those heading toward the flames; and we would *pray* more earnestly for God to *touch* their heart—giving them a *desire* for His Truth—as we are *Reaching a Critical Time!*

Knowing that thousands of people, every day, are plunging into the flames, is a stark reminder for us to take God's Truth *seriously*, and to live it even *more* seriously by the empowerment of His Spirit—Whom He gives as a gift—if we are *willing* to believe Him. New Testament teaching is so clear, that *no one* should miss the *importance* and the *need* to *live* by those words—*daily!*

Every *soul* is important to *God*, so every *soul* must be important to *us*. God is *loving* and *merciful*; so *we* must be *loving* and *merciful* toward everyone. Let us *prove* our sincerity by *praying* for those presently *outside* the will of God. We are to *pray* for others—*not* condemn them, because to *pray* for people 1 Timothy 2:3 "Is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; 4 Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth."

Living by the *Word of God* is planting the seed of *Trust on God*—as we make the journey on the Christian pathway. We may not *know* whose heart we may *touch* in a right way, by our *treating* them in a Christ-like manner. We may not *know* until we reach Heaven and see who is there.

Living the Word of Truth is planting the seed of Truth—and 1 Corinthians 3:6 "God gave the increase. 7 So then neither is he that planteth any thing, neither he that watereth; but God that giveth the increase." God is certainly faithful—but are we faithful to Him and shining the light of His Truth to people around us—that is the issue! Matthew 5:16 "Let your light so shine before men, that

they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven."

Since we *know* that this is a *critical time*, we should be more *eager* to *live* the Truth with the time we have *left*—shining the *light* of it to others in the world and asking God to enable that Truth we are living, to help someone who is *not* living it. We must be concerned for those who do *not* know the Truth God has so graciously given to us.

The light of Truth shines, when we *train* children in the ways of the Lord; when we *behave* in a Christ-like way toward people around us; when we *show* kindness and mercy toward someone who needs *both*; and when we show *compassion* toward anyone going through a difficult time.

The Bible says Judges 21:25 "In those days there was no king in Israel: every man did that which was right in his own eyes." The problem is, in their natural condition, no one knows what is right. When people do not follow the Lord, they follow the world—and there will be serious consequences for anyone who insists on doing what they think is right in their own eyes, rather than what is right in God's eyes!

Every day is an opportunity to ask God to take any *pride out* of our heart. Pride is so deadly that it will lead us to eternal suffering in the Lake of Fire if it is not removed. Proverbs 16:18 "Pride goeth before destruction, and an haughty spirit before a fall. 19 Better it is to be of an humble spirit with the lowly, than to divide the spoil with the proud." A proud spirit has taken *millions* to eternal destruction in Hell—the actual number would be beyond counting.

September 11th was a wake-up call for America—people began thinking about *faith* in God, and they became more spiritually *aware* after that attack—with the horrible repercussions of that dreadful time. Not long after, however, all too many soon moved *away* from God, and went

back to their jobs and routines of life without seeing any lasting change in their life or their attitudes towards others—except maybe being more bitter and hateful toward those responsible for the carnage.

Knowing that we are now reaching a critical time and that there is not much time left, we are compelled to focus our attention on really living by the instructions in the Bible—asking God in our every prayer, every day, for wisdom and spiritual enlightenment—whether we are sincere in living His Truth or not. Are we reflecting the light of Christ by the way we talk and walk and treat others!

An analogy: the moon must be correctly angled toward the sun in relation to the earth, in order for people to see the light of the sun reflecting from the moon. It is the same with believers in Christ—our life must be in alignment with God's Word, in order for people to see the light of His Son reflecting from us!

When we *read* the Bible and are willing to *obey* what is read—praying for wisdom and living by what we know is the will of God, then, and only then, are we *reflecting* the light of our Lord and Savior onto other people's lives. With the time we have left, and as God enables by His Spirit, let us *reflect* a *forgiving* and *compassionate* and *loving* attitude toward everyone!

Something to consider: When a person passes away, we think they are no longer living, but that is not true—actually, they just passed from one place to another; they relocated to a different place. Our soul cannot ever die—just *relocate!* The soul of every person who no longer lives on earth, is either *alive and well*; or *alive in Hell*—one of two—that is it.

We must pray that anyone whom God sees has a willing heart to believe, will hear the Gospel and will accept it as their way of life. It was once said: Live every day as if it were your last, and someday you'll be right!

From the beginning of our life, the clock counts down, the only thing we do not know is how much time is *left* on the clock. One thing we *do* know for *sure*, the clock *continues* to count—and what are we *doing* with the time we have *left*—is the question.

Each time the clock ticks, we are one second closer to eternity; and one second nearer to Christ's return. God has warned us to be Ephesians 5:16 "Redeeming the time, because the days are evil." We live in an evil time and are compelled to make the most of the time we have left.

2 Corinthians 6:2 "Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation." Romans 13:12 "The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light."

The horrible condition of the world is enough evidence—time is running out! Ephesians 5:17 "Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is. 20 Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

We have <u>Reached a Critical Time!</u> —now is the time to <u>repent</u>; to <u>forgive</u> everyone; and to do what is <u>required</u> of us Micah 6:8 "To do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" Now is the time to pray Luke 18:13 "God be merciful to me a sinner!"
