Why We Pray & Believe To Receive In Jesus' Name

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An overcoming and victorious life of faith on God, results from obeying Scripture by going to God <u>in prayer</u>, and <u>believing</u> in faith on the plain teaching of God's Word. The importance and <u>value</u> of praying with faith on God's Promises, and receiving the <u>benefits</u> of those Promises that He gave us, cannot be over-emphasized, because we <u>must believe</u> that <u>Jesus</u> (the Son of God) is <u>faithful</u> to what He has promised. (Rev. 2:6) "To him who <u>overcomes</u> I will give the <u>privilege</u> of eating the fruit of the Tree of Life, which is <u>in</u> the <u>Paradise</u> of God." (vs.11)"He who overcomes (meaning, by faith) shall be in no way hurt by the Second Death."

One's prayer life, in reality, is the most profitable subject that a Christian could ever want to comprehend, because it's through praying with faith (on the power of the Atonement Blood of Jesus Christ) that we can receive all blessings from God. His blessings will include spiritual, physical, financial, peace in our home, and every other good thing within God's will that we desire to have. That is why the Bible instructs us to pray about everything, because all things that concern us are received through prayers made in real faith on God's Word.

Receiving in Jesus' Name is a most <u>important matter</u> for everyone to consider, and, when rightly understood, it can open the way for God's power to be manifested in our personal life, (with our family, and in all other ways). There are only <u>two sources</u> of information regarding this 'life-giving' subject of '<u>prayer'</u> in Jesus' Name, and, of course God's written Word tells us the <u>real</u> Truth of the matter. The devil, however, has always worked hard to convince people that God has <u>changed</u>, and, that we can no longer receive answers to prayer from God.

We know from <u>Scriptures</u> that God and His <u>Word</u> has <u>not changed</u>, and the Atonement Blood of Jesus Christ is just as efficacious today (as in the first century). Scripture also clearly reveals that God loves us as much as He loves His only Son, whom He gave up <u>for us</u> when we were without strength and <u>ungodly</u>. That was the greatest expression of God's love for us, which is pure, unselfish, and perfect love—and <u>we</u> all <u>have</u> the <u>privilege</u> to prove <u>for</u> ourselves the <u>extent</u> of God's love for <u>us</u>.

The Bible reveals (by <u>teaching</u> and by <u>examples</u> of 'faith and trust'), that God is <u>always</u> willing to answer our every prayer, concerning every Scriptural need or desire that we may have in this present life. It is <u>our responsibility</u> (and our <u>choice</u>) to turn to God <u>in faith</u>,... (or, to turn to some <u>other source</u> of <u>supply</u> or <u>deliverance</u>). We should <u>understand</u> (and truly <u>believe</u>) that we have a God who <u>never changes</u>, and a <u>'living Christ'</u> who is the <u>same</u> yesterday, today, and forever, <u>because</u> the Bible tells us so. (Heb. 13:8). That is "<u>Why</u> We Pray"! to God through a '<u>living Christ'</u>.

The prayer life is exactly opposite to the way <u>un-believers</u> in the world meet the circumstances they face. The <u>customs</u> among most people in the world, are to always turn to someone else or some other plan, (<u>instead of turning to God and going to Him in prayer</u>). We are told, however, (Rom. 12:2) "And <u>do 'not'</u> follow the <u>customs</u> of the <u>present age</u>, but be <u>transformed</u> by the entire <u>renewal</u> of your <u>minds</u>", (a <u>changed 'mind-set'</u> that prays in faith to God, instead of depending on human plans and efforts of a life of 'self'),.. "so <u>that you may learn by experience</u> what <u>God's 'will' is</u> --that 'will' which is good and beautiful and perfect."

Most people in the world are so deceived they think that a true Christian is foolish to go to God in prayer (thus the 'Cross of Christ' is deprived of its power), (and the real serious part is that Scripture says they are on their way to the Lake of Fire, for they consider God's Word as foolishness, and, because of their unbelief they are cut off)(Rom. 11:20), (and "thrown aside for burning", Jesus said, Matt. 7:19). However, believers who pray to God are assured (1 Cor. 1:18), "For the Message of the Cross is foolishness to 'those' who are on the way to 'perdition', but it is the 'power of God' to those whom He is saving."

Scripture tells <u>believers</u> that we should pray about <u>every-thing</u> in our life, <u>not accept fear from the devil, nor be anxious</u> about <u>anything</u>. (Phil. 4:6-7) "Do not be <u>over-anxious</u> (NKJ says, 'careful') about anything," (that means not <u>worry</u> about anything because worry <u>hinders</u> real <u>faith</u>),... "but by <u>prayer</u> and <u>earnest pleading</u>, together <u>with thanksgiving</u>, let your request be unreservedly made known in the presence of God. And then the peace of God, which <u>transcends</u> all our <u>powers of thought</u>" (passes all human <u>understanding</u>), "will be a garrison to <u>guard</u> (or <u>keep</u>) your <u>hearts</u> and <u>minds</u> in <u>union with Christ Jesus</u>."

God's Word not only tells us that we <u>should pray</u>, but it tells us <u>when and how</u> to <u>pray</u>. (Matt. 11:28-29) "Come to me, all you <u>toiling</u> and <u>burdened</u> ones," (if we are burdened, <u>that</u> is <u>when</u> we should pray, the Lord said), "and *I* will give you <u>rest</u>." "Take my yoke upon you and <u>'learn'</u> from me"; (if we are <u>yoked to Christ</u> we will then <u>have to turn when He turns</u>, therefore, we <u>will be learning from Him</u> as He said),.. "for I am gentle and <u>lowly in heart</u>, and you will find rest for your souls." (Rest for our soul is something that only God could ever promise to a person).

We all have a <u>free-will choice</u> to <u>decide</u> to yoke ourselves to Christ (<u>commit our life</u> to Him), and then we can learn from Him, as He <u>promised</u> we will learn in His school <u>if</u> we <u>allow Him</u> to teach us.

One of the first lessons we learn in the school of Christ, is <u>how to pray</u> and <u>get answers</u>. We know nothing about this when we first <u>come to God</u>, and some people are very slow to allow God to teach them, after they accept the Truth. It is no sin to have other people pray for you (for we are told to pray for one another;)... <u>but</u> it <u>does become</u> a <u>sin</u> when we <u>depend</u> on other people's prayers. There are many cases of that kind, and <u>those souls</u> (who are precious in God's sight), are so deceived they do not realize what <u>terrible loss</u> they are <u>tolerating</u>.

In the early part of our Christian life, we are prone to get help from each other and to <u>lean on other</u> people's <u>prayers</u>. This is not entirely according to God's will, but He bears patiently with our ignorance and our <u>lack of understanding</u> His <u>divine</u> 'principles of Truth'. Sooner or later, however (and sooner the better), we will have to <u>measure up to</u> the <u>Bible teaching</u> on prayer, which is to deal with God ourselves. [Our victory lies <u>between us</u> and <u>God</u>, <u>not</u> between us and <u>the Church</u> or other <u>family members</u> or <u>friends</u>.] *M.P. *

In <u>God's</u> school of <u>learning</u>, He wants us to go to Him personally, deal with Him alone, and <u>get deliverance</u> <u>directly from Him</u>. The <u>spiritual result</u> of this is more valuable than all the answers to prayer that we could get. The <u>precise act</u> of dealing with God personally, indicates the death of 'self' in our <u>heart</u> and <u>life</u>. <u>What</u> could be <u>more valuable</u> than <u>that</u>!? That is what opens the way for our spiritual growth and development (or our "<u>holiness without which</u> no one will see the Lord."(Hebr.12:14). It also means the supply of every need or Scriptural desire, which <u>is success</u> in the prayer life, and it is "<u>Why We Pray</u>" (as in this message title).

God wants us to be perfectly happy <u>in Christ Jesus</u>, and to have everything we <u>need</u> and every <u>Scriptural desire</u>. Also, to be fully protected, have the <u>spiritual insight</u> and <u>guidance</u> that we need, and be comforted physically, socially, financially (and every other blessing for our home and loved ones). We also want to realize that God is delighted to <u>do</u> all <u>these things for us</u>, if we will only go to Him in faith and <u>ask Him</u> in prayer, He <u>promised</u> that we are to <u>receive through prayer</u>.

Jesus told us about a wonderful <u>privilege</u> we have in the prayer-life. When He was here on earth, people went to Him and received any 'light' and 'deliverance' they wanted, but just <u>before He went away</u> He <u>told them</u> (and <u>everyone</u> else), that after He left they could go <u>directly to God</u> and <u>receive</u> any <u>Scriptural desire</u>. (John 16:23), "And in that day you will ask Me nothing. Most <u>assuredly</u>, I say to you, whatever you <u>ask the Father in My Name</u> He will give you." (Meaning, they would no longer be able to come to Him in the flesh, but <u>if</u> they would <u>pray to His Father in faith</u> in Jesus' Name, they would be sure to <u>receive the answer</u> from Him. What that <u>really means is</u>, that <u>through</u> His Atonement Blood, and the power of His 'resurrection to <u>life'</u> (which <u>defeated Satan forever</u>), Jesus would open the way for us to get whatever we need and desire from <u>God</u>.

<u>Satan</u> makes every effort to <u>hinder</u> us <u>from</u> going to God in <u>faith</u> (in prayer), and, he tries to rob us of the valuable spiritual blessings connected with it. Satan doesn't mind if we get money, social standing, health, or anything else, (so long as we get it in <u>some other way than</u> from going <u>personally to God</u>). Our going to God is what <u>Satan</u> bitterly <u>opposes</u> (because he knows that we will get <u>spiritual encouragement</u> from <u>God</u>).

Satan will <u>tell us</u> that we are <u>not good enough</u> to go to God in prayer, <u>or</u> that there is something <u>wrong with</u> us, and, that we can't receive from God. He <u>wants us to think</u> there is <u>some</u> vague or mysterious <u>reason</u> that we cannot understand, which leaves us in the dark. But we do not have to pay one bit of attention to anything that the devil says to us or tries to picture to our mind. However, <u>if</u> there <u>is</u> anything that we are really doing <u>wrong</u>, it <u>should not only be confessed</u>, but it should also <u>be forsaken</u>, so that we can <u>expect to be successful in prayer</u>.

The devil will always suggest past <u>failures</u> to our <u>mind</u>, and sins and mistakes, in order to <u>make us think</u> that God will not answer our prayers. Those thoughts are directly from Satan. He knows that <u>if</u> he can <u>defile</u> <u>our conscience</u>, he will be able to <u>block</u> or <u>hinder our faith to receive</u>. The <u>receiving end</u> is really the <u>only place</u> that he <u>can hinder us</u>, (<u>because</u> everything we need or desire is <u>already knocking at our door</u> and trying to get in), and God is very eager to do everything He possibly can to enable us to receive it.

There must be something mighty stubborn on our part that would hinder such love and power of God, as we refuse to take Him at His Word and let the victory be received. Limiting God and not allowing His power to work for us, is a condition we must get rid of (if we want to get eternal Life). The promise given (John 16:24) would include eternal Life, "Until now you have asked nothing in My name. Ask, and you will receive, that your 'joy may be full'." (Receiving Eternal Life by faith on God's Word, would surely be that 'fullness of joy' that God promises for allowing His power to work for us).

True prayer is not just idle worship and merely going over some words without expecting to receive (the late Pastor said). That does not amount to anything at all. Most denominational churches, and the Catholics, only go through a form of prayer (which is just as senseless as it is ineffective). If anyone acted that way when dealing with other people, they would be considered as simple-minded and not having any sense. Would a person go into a grocery store, ask for the items needed, and then leave without taking the items with them? It is the same when we ask God for things in prayer, (with the exception that we must furnish the money to pay the grocer for things we asked for). When we ask God for something in prayer, the price has already been paid by the shed Blood of Christ, and the things were already promised to us. We do not have to pay again for what God has already given us in His 'Promises'. That

means there is <u>nothing in the way</u> (on God's part), to <u>hinder</u> our receiving every blessing that Jesus Christ provided for us on the Cross. That is why we pray in Jesus' Name!

If you were to see an advertised item in a store, you would know that the merchant wanted to sell it to you. If you had the money to pay for it, you would feel sure that you could receive it from the merchant. You had the money, he wanted to sell the item, and you wanted to take it from him. Three <u>conditions</u> were <u>met</u>, and you would not consider the aspect of your faith in the transaction.

When we want to deal with God, the <u>devil tries to tell us</u> that <u>we do not have enough faith to receive</u> what we want from God (which <u>is a lie in itself</u>). Would we ever think that the person we were purchasing something from, would say that we don't have enough faith to receive the article from him? <u>Satan</u>, <u>however</u>, <u>tries to tell us</u> that <u>we don't have enough faith to receive</u> what <u>God</u> has <u>promised</u>. <u>If we believed</u> that <u>lie of Satan</u>, we would <u>think</u> that it <u>is no use</u> for us to <u>pray to</u> God, (and that it does <u>not make any sense</u> to pray to God in a <u>meaningless</u> form of worship).

So, it is just as much <u>nonsense to think</u> that we can't receive what God has <u>already given us</u> in His <u>Word</u>. God does not answer our prayers because of our faith, <u>nor hold it back</u> because we don't have faith. <u>Our faith does not affect God's giving us what He promised, it effects our receiving answers to prayer from Him</u>.

<u>Jesus Christ</u> (the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world), (through His death on Calvary's Cross) <u>answers</u> our <u>prayers</u>, and He said, that everything that we need for time and eternity is <u>already ours for the asking</u>. <u>God could not</u> withhold our deliverance and answers to prayer <u>if we</u> are willing to receive them. The only thing that could block them, is for <u>us</u> to <u>believe the lies of Satan</u>, and <u>refuse to receive</u> in <u>God's way</u>.

There are two reasons why God answers our prayers. First, because He loves us as much as He loves His only Son, and He is intensely eager to give us everything we need, and every Scriptural desire for our happiness.

The second reason is closely allied with the first, that is the 'Blood of Christ', which has taken every obstacle out of the way of God's intense love, and has opened the way for Him to give us all that we need and desire within His will. The Blood of Christ is the merit price already paid for us. God's love is the incentive, and it is He who gives us the faith and confidence to believe and receive from Him, just as we would receive from another person on this earth (by believing that we are going to receive something from them).

We must <u>believe</u> that <u>God</u> and the <u>Blood of Jesus Christ stands behind every 'promise</u>' that He had given us in His Word. It is <u>like</u> believing the Government's word that paper money (promissory notes) we get from them, is the <u>same</u> as the gold that stands behind it. We just accept their promises, the same as we must accept the promises given us in God's Word when we <u>deal personally</u> with <u>Him</u> in <u>prayer</u>. He is faithful to His promises, and <u>that is</u> "Why We Believe".

We are given <u>vital</u> passages of Scripture(Hebr.10:), that should encourage us, and with God's help and blessing will make our praying to God more profitable and successful. God inspired these verses to be written for us, (vs. 19-20), "Since then, brethren, we have <u>free access</u> to the Holy place through the blood of Jesus", (<u>meaning, come into God's presence</u> with boldness and do not be fainthearted), for "by <u>the new and ever-living way</u>" (a <u>way which never closes</u> nor <u>changes</u>, even though many churches of the world teach that God will not answer prayer <u>because</u> He has changed); but <u>it is a way</u> "which He opened up for us through the <u>rending of the veil</u>--that is to say, of His <u>earthly nature</u> (or the <u>rending of His fleshly-nature</u>).. (Vs.21-22) "and since we have a great Priest <u>who has authority</u> over the 'house of God', <u>let us draw near with sincerity</u> and <u>unfaltering faith (with a heart in assurance of faith')</u> "having had our <u>hearts</u> sprinkled, once for all, <u>from consciences oppressed with sin</u>, and our bodies bathed in pure water."

We do not go to God in prayer just to <u>ask</u> for something <u>without</u> <u>believing</u> that we have received what was already provided for us. (Vs. 23) "Let us hold firmly to an <u>unflinching avowal of our</u> hope, [in other words, true sincerity of heart, and <u>settling</u> in our mind <u>to meet God's easy condition</u> for <u>victory</u>], [by <u>believing</u> what <u>He has told us</u> in His Word, <u>instead of believing</u> the lies of Satan causing us to doubt] "<u>for He is faithful</u> who gave us the promises." <u>That is</u>, "Why We Pray", because we <u>believe</u> what <u>'God' has told us</u>.

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SOME MAIN POINTS ARE: 1... Nothing could be more profitable to a Christian than to fully understand the 'prayer life', because praying in faith on the power of the Atonement Blood of Christ is from where all blessings flow.

2.. When we refuse to take God at His Word, our stubbornness hinders God's power from working for us so our victory can be received. (Luke 13;34) "how often have I desired to gather thy children(just as a hen gathers her brood under her wings), and you would not come!" (It is unwillingness to believe, not because of lack of power on God's part that we do not receive).
