Some Christians Fall From Faith-II

(IF THEIR SURRENDER IS NOT FINAL)

Part one of this lesson revealed why many professed Christians fall away from the Truth, and why Satan regains control of their life. That happens because a circumstance comes into one's life, in which they refuse to meet it in God's way (according to the way His Word instructs the Christian, and by following the example set by His Son, Who told us to follow Him). And, God's voice issued from the cloud, (Mark 9:7), saying, "This is My Son, dearly loved: listen to Him."

So, the person who falls away from true faith in Christ, did not exercise their power of choice correctly (in some part of their life), when they **chose** not to listen to Jesus' instructions, and **chose** not to meet a temptation in God's way.

Nevertheless, our Savior Jesus Christ, has already ascended to Heaven, and is at the right side of God's throne, <u>pleading</u> for each one to <u>come back</u> to Him. "Return to Me, and I will return to you," says the LORD Almighty. (Malachi 3:7).

So, we can see that God requires a willingness on our part, to make a genuine repentance and a sincere confession of those sins, mistakes, and wrong choices. God is not looking for a half-hearted confession from us (that didn't work for Ananias and Sapphira Acts 5), and only God knows what is really in our heart when we confess to Him. So, we can't go half-way with God by just saying we are sorry (to get out of trouble for the time being). Our conviction has to be sincere. God knows our heart! (What our intentions really are). The next step is for us to believe that we are forgiven, pardoned and cleansed, and freed from the devil's power to have us fall back into sin. We must believe that God's Holy Spirit is going to help us decide scripturally and be willing to follow His guidance. (instead of relying on our own plans of the self-life which Satan will always suggest if our decision is not final to do God's will).

If we have made a final decision to meet every situation Scripturally, then the Holy Spirit can inspire us to follow Christ (in all things in our

life). That is, getting back to God right, and being born <u>again</u> of the Spirit. That is what it means to make a <u>final surrender</u> to <u>do</u> the <u>will</u> of <u>God</u> in all circumstances.

By using our *power of choice* right (when temptation comes) we will be in a position to <u>draw</u> from <u>God's strength</u> and <u>power</u> to <u>bring us</u> to victory. God will <u>keep us from falling away</u> from real faith in Him, because we have made a <u>final</u> decision to meet things Scripturally (and we <u>remain trusting</u> Him 1 John 5:18 tells us) "but He who is 'God's <u>Child' keeps</u> him, and the <u>evil one</u> cannot touch him.

If we had to go on a <u>long journey</u>, but we started out by saying to ourselves, "if everything goes okay and the weather is good, I will go, but if things do <u>not</u> go to <u>suit me</u>, I am going to turn back", we would very often and very quickly <u>turn back</u>. We might as well <u>not</u> have <u>started</u> in the first place, if we are going to give in and give up at the first difficulty.

It is the same in the Christian life. Jesus told us there would be <u>persecutions</u> along the way. If we start out with a <u>limit</u> on how far we will go in <u>doing</u> the <u>will</u> of God, thinking that we will <u>turn back</u> if things don't go as <u>we</u> had <u>planned</u>, then we have only made a <u>limited</u> surrender of our life to God. We have left a plank on the bridge (instead of <u>burning</u> behind us that *bridge of self-trust*). That kind of <u>limited surrender</u> will allow the devil to use it as a <u>weapon</u> to destroy us for eternity, (if it is not repented of).

If we have it in our mind that we will meet someone or something scripturally (as long <u>as they</u> treat <u>us right</u>), we can be <u>sure</u> that we will be <u>tested</u> in that way. We might as well <u>make</u> a <u>final decision</u>, that with <u>God's help</u> we are going to <u>meet</u> the person (or situation) <u>right</u> in the first place. We will only have to meet it again if we don't. The <u>mistreatment</u> will <u>continue</u> and <u>keep recurring</u>, until we meet the wrong treatment in a Christlike way (which <u>is</u> to <u>not retaliate</u>, but to <u>turn</u> the other cheek, as Jesus commanded). (Matt.5:39) "But I tell you <u>not</u> to <u>resist</u> a wicked man, but if anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn the other to him as well."

When one 'chooses' not to listen to God's Son (to meet things right), it blocks the influence of God's Spirit. It is both where and why the devil is able to gain an influence over a person and cause them to fall away from real faith in Christ.

Adam's wrong *choice* to believe the <u>lie</u> (in what <u>seemed</u> to be a <u>small</u> circumstance), enabled the devil to take possession of him, and

he *fell away* from *trusting* God. He (Adam) then began following his <u>own efforts</u> of the self-life. He lost the blessing <u>and</u> guidance of the Holy Spirit, and, showed no sign of repentance.

Again, the real <u>cause</u> of people *falling* away from the Truth, is the type of <u>surrender</u> they made to God. In Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (and all through the New Testament), we have God's '<u>standard</u> of righteousness'. If anyone is willing to <u>accept</u> it and <u>maintain</u> an attitude of complete surrender to <u>God's</u> will, <u>He</u> will <u>keep</u> them from *falling* away from the *faith*. (Jude 1:24-25) says, "To <u>Him</u> who is <u>able</u> to <u>keep you from falling</u>, and to <u>present you before his glorious</u> presence without <u>fault</u> and with great joy-, to the only <u>God our Savior</u> be glory, majesty, power and authority, through Jesus Christ our Lord, before all ages, now and forevermore! Amen."

If we want God to keep <u>us</u> from falling away from the faith, our surrender must be final so <u>He</u> can take possession of our life. If our surrender is not right, we can be deceived and destroyed forever, by Satan (who prowls about like a lion, <u>seeking whom</u> he <u>may devour</u>).

If a <u>worldly person</u> had a <u>thousand</u> dollars, and put <u>five hundred</u> in the bank, and someone stole the five hundred they had on themselves, they could not <u>blame</u> the <u>bank</u> for that loss. If they had given the <u>whole</u> amount to the bank, the bank would have been <u>responsible</u> for the whole amount.

It is the same with God, if we give Him full possession of ourselves (not just go half-way with our surrender), He would be responsible to keep us, and He will protect us (when we give Him full possession of ourselves, not holding onto the self-life in some area). People who believe in 'Once Saved, Always Saved', don't make a right surrender to God in the first place. They believe that if they just accept historical facts concerning the work of Jesus Christ on the Cross, then they are 'saved' and cannot be lost, even if they fail to 'do the will of God' (as Jesus said we must do) by obeying (or following) the teaching given in the New Testament.

The <u>truth</u> <u>is</u>, however, they <u>never allowed</u> <u>God to have their life</u> in the first place, (because they never <u>fully surrendered</u> their <u>self-will</u>, to do <u>God's</u> will in everything, and most importantly to <u>learn from His teaching</u> and <u>training</u>).

Those who fall away from faith haven't learned to trust God to comfort them in spirit or

body (instead of depending on other persons, things, or devices to seek comfort). Nor did they learn to trust God 'day by day' financially (but instead, having a little cushion stored up saved up, or a plan of the self-life to fall back on. Rather than getting rid of laid up money (and other treasures) by helping the poor (as our Savior commanded), they try to amass treasures for themselves, and try to increase their laid-up money, gambling on the stock market or other ways that Satan devises. All too often, they deceive others and convince them to accept their plans of the self-life.

All of this <u>misplaced trust</u> is <u>unbelief</u> as well as a disregard for God's Word that leads one to Life Eternal (<u>and</u> the Bible explains that <u>unbelief</u> is <u>idolatry</u>). It is trusting on something else aside from God, and idols are in a multitude of forms in the life of an <u>idolater</u>. The Bible instructs us to "<u>come out from among" idolaters</u> (Isaiah 52:), and (2 Cor.6:17), "and separate yourselves, says the Lord", (which means, <u>not</u> to seek their company nor keep close fellowship with them). Doing so, can be <u>spiritually harmful</u> to yourself and your family).

(Romans 16:17-20) says, "I urge you, brothers, to <u>watch</u> <u>out</u> for those who cause <u>divisions</u>, and put <u>obstacles</u> in your way that are <u>contrary</u> to the <u>teaching</u> you have <u>learned</u>. <u>Keep away from them</u>. For <u>such</u> people are <u>not serving</u> our Lord Christ, but their <u>own appetites</u>. By <u>smooth talk</u> and <u>flattery</u>, they <u>deceive</u> the <u>minds</u> of <u>naive</u> people. Everyone has heard about your <u>obedience</u>, so I am full of joy over you; <u>but</u> I want you to be <u>wise</u> about what is good, and <u>innocent</u> about what is <u>evil</u>. The <u>God</u> of <u>peace</u> will soon <u>crush Satan</u> under <u>your feet</u>. The grace of our Lord Jesus be with you."

The <u>Holy Spirit</u> (Who prepares a person to be ready for Eternal Life, through His sanctifying work within their heart), is grieved to be shut out of one's life, for <u>He</u> wants <u>no</u> <u>one</u> to perish. (Ephes.4:30) warns us, "And <u>beware</u> of grieving the <u>Holy Spirit of God</u>, in whom you have been <u>sealed in preparation for</u> the day of Redemption." [That <u>preparation is</u> the <u>spiritual</u> "growth in holiness," "apart from which no one will see the Lord."] (Heb.12:14).

(Luke 14:) Jesus <u>describes</u> <u>another</u> <u>phase</u> <u>of</u> a <u>full</u> <u>surrender</u> to God, "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his father and mother, his wife and children, his brothers, and sisters--yes, even

his own life--he <u>cannot</u> be my disciple. And anyone who does not carry his cross and <u>follow</u> me, cannot be my disciple."

"What does that have to do with our surrender? (one might ask). It means that at some time in our Christian life, we will be called upon to go against the wishes of our unsaved loved ones. We may be called to put God and His will ahead of a member of our family (who is not following the Truth that God has enlightened us to understand). We may even be called upon to risk our life for the sake of obeying God's Word, and, if our surrender is not genuine; if we have not settled it that God and His will shall come ahead of everything and everybody; then we will take a big fall spiritually, at the first opposition from the devil.

A real surrender to God for <u>divine healing</u>, means that we have settled it <u>not to use</u> a <u>human remedy</u> (or get a doctor under any circumstance), whatever the risk may be.

A true <u>surrender</u> to <u>God</u> for our <u>financial</u> <u>affairs</u>, means that <u>under no circumstance</u> will we <u>borrow</u>, <u>beg</u>, or <u>take anything on credit</u>; <u>not</u> even <u>give</u> a <u>hint</u> by <u>word</u> or <u>act</u> that we are <u>in need</u> of a thing. If our children were starving (and it <u>seemed that</u> we were all going to end up in a poorhouse), we would not seek help from anyone but God.

A <u>final surrender</u> like that, will place God (and all of His resources) at our side to supply what is needed. Instead of landing in the poorhouse (as <u>Satan</u> would picture to our mind), we can <u>live in prosperity</u>, <u>not lacking anything</u> we <u>need</u> (<u>when</u> our <u>surrender is final</u> to <u>keep</u> our <u>place of trust centered on God</u>. It is just as important to meet our <u>financial</u> battles in God's way, as it is to meet any <u>other</u> battle (because it perfects our *trust* on the Son of God).

Physical battles are also most important to be met right, as well as meeting Scripturally those mean things that are said and done to us. When we have truly made a final surrender of our life to God, the wonderful part is, He will not allow anything to touch us, that He will not also inspire us to meet right and be victorious.

Every circumstance met in God's way, will increase our "spiritual growth" and knowledge of God. It means enthronement of the Christ-life within us; and, of course death of the self-life (that of, depending on other sources for peace of mind, comfort of body, temporal supply, or physical healing).

If one refuses to meet a temptation according to God's will, things can work out the opposite, and, we will lose out spiritually (whether we are aware of that or not). Satan will get control over a person (that he did not have before), and God's power will become less and less. When we shut out God's power, He cannot keep us delivered and protected from Satan's attacks (and cannot prevent our falling away from faith in His Son). We cannot be under the control of Satan and the Holy Spirit at the same time. One or the other will be in control of our life.

Our surrender to God <u>must be at all cost</u>, <u>as it was</u> with the three Hebrew children, Daniel, and other true Christians in the Bible. <u>Many people</u> have made a decision to put <u>their home</u> and their <u>family</u> in <u>God's hands</u>, <u>but their decision was not a final one</u>. Deep in their <u>heart there was a hidden plan</u>, such as; "I will trust God if everything goes well", but if the husband (or wife) becomes disagreeable, or if the children get disobedient, then "I'll have to take action."

We will never get any victory in our home and with the family, as long as we have a reservation in our heart to use force and selfeffort to control them (or the situation). In order to put our family into God's hands to stay, we must settle it that if adult children became more disobedient than ever, we will not take any forceful action of ourselves to change them. When we have said our last word and taken our last action of the self-life to convict them, then God can work quickly to change them (by His Spirit and from within their heart, where the change really has to be made). When we get out of the way and allow God to work, He can bring them into the Truth right (and without bringing any unscriptural habits along with them).

It is the *limit* that we put on our *surrender* to do God's will, which allows Satan to hinder us spiritually, and, if not repented of, it will allow Satan and his agents to deceive us, and cause us to fall away from the faith. The temptations we meet, are for the purpose of perfecting our surrender to do God's Will. That is why we are tempted in so many different ways. (2 Cor.13:5) "Test yourselves to discover whether you are true believers: put your own selves examination. Or do you not know that Jesus Christ is within you, unless you are insincere?"

[<u>Let us consider</u> for a moment that <u>Abraham</u>, our <u>prince leader</u> in the faith, was <u>already</u>

declared righteous by God, Himself. (Gen. 15:6), 'Abram **believed the LORD** and He <u>credited</u> it to him as <u>righteousness</u>.' (<u>Proponents</u> of the eternal security myth (or O.S.A.S.), would say that Abraham was already saved at that point). However, many years later, "God tested Abraham" (Gen.22:1 says). He still had to pass God's supreme test of his faith to see if his surrender was final to do God's will in his life and be **saved**, for Jesus said, "only those who do the will of my Father in Heaven." (To do God's will) Abraham had to raise a knife over his son Isaac to slay him. (Imagine how we would feel, if God instructed us to raise a knife over a son of ours.) However, Abraham passed the test of his faith and surrender, by raising the knife over his son, but God 'stayed his hand'. (Heb.11:19) "For he reckoned (believed) that God is even able to raise a man up from among the dead, and, figuratively speaking it was from among the dead that he received Isaac again." For God said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only by son, from Me."

Abraham (who had already been declared righteous by God, many years before), had just passed the final test of his faith! (So much for the eternal security myth of O.S.A.S., which says we don't need to remain in the faith until the end, to receive the crown.) [But, Jesus explained clearly (Rev. 2:10) that you will be tested and persecuted, but to "be faithful to end (unto death) and I will give you the 'Crown of Life'"!

So, when <u>our surrender</u> is <u>perfect</u>, and we have come to the place that <u>neither life nor death</u>, friends <u>nor foe</u>, <u>men or devils</u>, will <u>ever cause us</u> to <u>disobey God</u>, then, and only then, will our troubles disappear. Efforts of Satan to <u>make our life unhappy</u> and <u>unpleasant</u>, <u>will be defeated</u>. God's <u>fullness of blessing spiritually</u>, <u>physically</u>, <u>financially</u>, in the <u>home</u>, <u>workshop</u>, and everything else that concerns us, will <u>be turned</u> into a peaceful garden.

It is the mercy of God that Satan is allowed to tempt us in many ways. As we meet those temptations according to God's Will, it will perfect our surrender to Him, and will establish us firmly in the Truth of God. As we progress in the Christian life, we should be more convinced than ever before, that the real 'Gospel plan' must be lived out in every detail of our life, in order to be prepared for "Eternal Life" (as well as receive His

fullness of blessing in this life).

Two of the <u>most important things</u> we <u>need</u> to <u>understand</u> (<u>if</u> we want to be protected from <u>falling away from</u> the "Truth of God"), are; <u>first</u>, to <u>be sure</u> that our <u>surrender to God</u> is <u>genuine</u> and <u>final</u>, and that we will <u>not turn our back</u> on God's Truth under any circumstance (whether <u>or not</u> it pleases our family, friends, or whoever).

The **second** point is that we must apply God's plan (or Word) to every circumstance that arises in our life, whether someone does a wrong to us, a temptation in our "spiritual life", a financial battle, or physical oppression.

A final surrender like that to do God's Will, will shut down the power and work of Satan to make our life unhappy, and it will open the door for God to come in and make our Christian life a pleasant, 'learning experience' with 'Eternal Life' as the 'ultimate reward'!

SOME MAIN POINTS OF SOME CHRISTIANS FALL FROM FAITH-II:

- 1. The <u>cause</u> of why people fall away is not making a final surrender to God.
- 2. The importance of making <u>right</u> choices, and *getting back* to God right is explained, (and we never lose that *power of choice*).
- 3. The example of God's <u>testing</u> of Abraham's faithful obedience, after many years in a life of faith is mentioned, (<u>emphasizing that our faith must endure to the end.</u>)
