BENEFITS OF SURRENDERING NATURE OF SELF-LIFE

Previous messages considered some details of a transformation that needs to be made in each person's life, to have the nature of a selflife fully removed from our heart (so a 'nature of Jesus Christ can take its place within). We also learned that with 'self' removed, we can then be made over by God to have a <u>pure heart</u> within, and, re-made back into the perfect <u>being</u> that God created in the Garden of Eden (before mankind sinned against Him. In that way, God, Himself can prepare us for Eternal Life in Heaven, instead of eternal torment.

As God allows us to be spiritually <u>tested</u>, we may be attacked physically in our body, or in financial matters, or in our home-life, and we can rest-assured that the self-life within us is deeper than we think, also, that God in His <u>great mercy</u> has allowed these things to happen, so that our eyes may be opened for us to see where that traitorous nature of 'self' is still hidden within our heart. We also need to realize that a self-life can be eliminated and completely gotten rid of. When it is, these troubles will all come to an end.

All of this can be accomplished in our life by God, if we will simply turn our life over into God's hands, for Him to have His way with us (whether it pleases us or not). We need to make a deliberate and final choice to do just that in our life, and <u>without</u> reservation. That is God's Plan for everyone, which <u>is not taught</u> in <u>so-called</u> <u>Christian circles</u>, however, <u>we</u> need to make that decision in <u>our life</u> so self cam be removed by God's mercy and grace, since it is necessary for us to have the self-nature removed so we can get to Heaven.

<u>First of all</u> we need to <u>repent of sin</u>, and have every 'sin of self' pardoned and cleansed from our heart, .. and a <u>second step</u> to make an unconditional surrender or our will and life to God. That would be (as Scripture tells us), "Holy, acceptable unto God, which is <u>your</u> reasonable service." (Rom.12:2).

A pure heart within is a wonderful thing for one to experience, that is, to have malice, bitterness, hatred, strife, unbelief, and all hypocrisy taken out of our heart. A most blessed thing is to have a heart which can forgive enemies, and those who say and do wrongs against us (and our family), and to have a heart that knows, loves, and fears God. and which would hunger and thirst after God, to receive fulfillment of what Jesus' Promised, for everyone who will listen and follow His Words, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness; for they shall be filled." (Matt.5:6). (Meaning that we shall be inspired with the true character of God, so that we can have within us, the same love, mercy, and power that He has.)

That pure heart within, will enable us to be willing to <u>meet</u> circumstances of life as they come, and to meet them <u>according to God's Plan</u>. His Plan emerges from a pure heart, and it can be divided into three general 'principles of Truth', but we need to get some idea of what these principles are, and of what the final 'death of self' really means to our eternal interests.

A first <u>principal</u> <u>part</u> of God's plan is that we are never to <u>resent</u>, <u>nor</u> try to <u>resist</u> in <u>our</u> <u>strength</u> any wrongs done toward us. We need to realize that we are <u>not</u> to <u>resent</u> <u>mistreatment</u>, whether at the workshop by employer or employee, or by a wife or husband in the home (or <u>mistreatment</u> coming from other sources).

We are not to touch the problem in our own strength to try to correct it (if it costs us our life), which is a 'vital principle to be met' in the 'death of self' from within. The natural heart of man will always resent evil when he is wronged and not treated right, and he immediately wants to pick up and get out; while a spiritual person does not resent nor resist evil. Our only hope of Heaven is to allow God to fight our battles, and He is to conquer our enemies for us. (That is brought out clearly (Rom.12:19-20) "Do not be revengeful, my dear friends, but give way before anger; for it is written, "REVENGE BELONGS TO ME: I WILL PAY BACK, says the Lord." "On the contrary, therefore, IF YOUR ENEMY IS HUNGRY, GIVE HIM FOOD; IF HE IS THIRSTY, QUENCH HIS THIRST. FOR BY DOING THIS YOU WILL BE HEAPING BURNING COALS UPON HIS HEAD. Do not be overcome by evil but overcome the evil with goodness."

When people <u>treat us mean</u>, it <u>will cause</u> '<u>self</u>' to rise up from within, and we are <u>tempted</u> to <u>not</u> '<u>meet the meanness right</u>'. When <u>we finally</u> <u>decide</u> to <u>meet it right</u>, it will <u>end</u> the trouble in our life, <u>end</u> all strife, and every separation caused by the self-life which is controlled by Satan. This all must be made right and the circumstances met right in God's way, or to go to the Pit blindfolded. When our last self-effort has ceased, and God alone is working on that case against us, our very <u>enemies will be at peace with us</u> (as Scripture assures us Prov.16:7), (and our difficulties will end.)

God is able by His presence and power to keep and uphold us <u>spiritually</u>. He <u>will heal and</u> <u>protect our body without</u> the slightest <u>human</u> <u>remedy</u> on our part, also <u>will supply</u> our <u>financial</u> needs from His 'riches in glory by Christ Jesus'.

A second important step toward the elimination of 'self' from our heart and life, is; When we truly give God His place, and we can say from our heart "All my spiritual help from Thee I bring; all my physical and financial help from Thee I bring; as I choose to depend on 'the living God alone'; .. when that final decision has been made, and we have given up our last effort of 'self', made our last hint for others around us to help us;, and made the last self-effort to make a way of escape for ourselves; ..then a fullness of blessing spiritually and physically will be the result, along with the complete 'death of self' within. That will be like putting a big spike in the 'coffin of self to keep him there, so he cannot get back into our heart and life.

A <u>third</u> principle <u>part</u> of the <u>self-life</u> that must be <u>gotten</u> <u>rid</u> <u>of</u>, is that we would naturally think that we need to be worrying about things that seem to be important in a 'life of self' In reality, <u>worry</u> is like a 'crutch of the self-life' that we lean on (and we could probably say truthfully that everyone of us is worrying about somet<u>hing</u> <u>somewhere</u> in our life). However, God has told us <u>not to be</u> 'anxious about anything', but that we should turn all things over to Him to <u>be taken care</u> <u>of for us</u>.

We <u>could</u> classify ourselves (the late Pastor said) and see just <u>how much of</u> that <u>old</u> <u>'self-life' is still within</u> us, by how much we worry about certain things instead of turning them over to God and <u>believing</u> that <u>He is taking care</u> of that issue for us. We <u>need to realize that God</u> is <u>saying</u> to <u>us</u>, that <u>if</u> there is <u>something that</u> we <u>need to</u> do to make corrections where they are needed, then <u>He will show that to us</u>, but as far as our worrying is concerned, He has also <u>told us that</u> 'He <u>will do that part</u> for us'.

God has taken that prerogative upon Himself to do that work for us, which we can conclude is a 'rather nice thing' for us. We have been so used to having some kind of burden on our hands to try to drag us down and to be worrying about, that we think something is wrong if we are not worrying. Also, that we need that 'worry crutch' of the self-life to lean on. But what a crutch Satan makes worry out to be in our life, and it is one of the last crutches of 'self' that we find so hard to be rid of from our 'spiritual condition', (since the human heart seems to want to hold onto worrying, instead of, turning matters over to God and believing that He will take control.

We may find ourselves worrying about our 'spiritual condition', or about how we are to meet temptations, or we may hear another person say, "I need to worry about my own spiritual condition. But, according to God's Word, we should just be concerned enough to turn our 'spiritual condition' over to God, and be among those "who are kept by the power of God 'through faith for salvation' ready to be revealed in the last time."(1 Pet.1:5).

We may think that surely, we must worry about our 'loved ones' (instead of placing them in God's hands and believing that He will work in their life) (as well as in our own life). Or. we may worry about where the money will come from to pay the rent and to buy heating fuel this winter? Or, that surely I must worry about my spouse (instead of, also placing them in God's capable hands to be controlled and guided by Him) (which is what God wants to do and is waiting to do for us). But we all need to learn the great lesson of putting our confidence in God (and that is what He wants to teach us to do). And, when we have come to have that knowledge of God, we will have found something that is more valuable than any gold mine in the world, because it will include our Eternal Life interests'. So, we need to take heed to the inspired instructions given us in God's Word. (Phil.4;6-7) "Be anxious (careful) for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." (Or) "will be a garrison to guard your hearts and minds in union with Christ Jesus."

Being careful for nothing is a mighty big factor in the death of the 'self-life', (because worrying becomes a hindrance to our 'life of faith' on God). When we <u>will give up what</u> we may think to be our 'privilege' to worry, we have put a big nail in the 'coffin of self' (the late Pastor said). "And, when we worry about something (instead of placing it in God's capable hands), that is going against God's Word, so it would be a disobedience toward God. Every word of instruction for us in the Bible, will hit against some area of the self-life that we were born with, (because God knows that it must be removed and replaced by the 'nature of Christ').

On a personal note, the late Pastor said, "I hardly thought that I could teach about the question of getting rid of 'worry', because I can honestly confess that it hit me pretty hard in my Christian life. If anybody came from a 'worrying family', it was myself. I had a mother who continually worried about where this or that of needed things would come from, and I inherited that same attitude. What a battle we have had to learn to trust God without worry', but I knew that He had victory for me, and that we can become victorious."

"I also want to acknowledge to the glory of God, that He has given me the victory, and to say that He will do the same for anyone who trust Him for that. This is a vital point in the 'death of self' from within us, that is, when God's Word says "be careful for nothing," it includes the least thing to the greatest." Again, "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God."

The only privilege we must worry about something, is to tell God all about it, and that kind of worrying really means 'not to worry at all'. That certainly strikes a blow to the 'self-life', and it is some blow (because turning the matter over to God without worry or doubting, leaves no room for Satan to disturb our peace).

So, we are to open our heart to God without reserve and tell everything to Him. Let us think about that, the very moment a 'worry' presents itself, we go to God and <u>tell Him about</u> <u>it</u>. That is because it is God's business to take care of that worry for us, just as it is for a shoemaker to repair shoes, or a barber to cut a person's hair, or "a chiropractor to nearly jerk a person's head off to try to relieve them from joint or back pain."(the Pastor said).

(He continued) "the very fact of people running to everybody else to have them pray for them (instead of telling their problem to God), is a terrible mistake, and it is unscriptural. If there is any one thing that the Bible teaches by Word and example (from Genesis to Revelation), it is we are not to dump our troubles on anybody but God. We have written instructions {Psalm 50;15) "Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify Me." We will never get fully delivered out of trouble (or problem) until we do that (as that would indicate that 'self' still has a foothold in our life and heart).

The Pastor queried, "what do you suppose a little girl would do if she were in trouble, and her father was nearby on one side and her mother on the other side? Would she run to Mr. Jones or Mrs. Smith and ask them to help her? 'Never', but she would hurry to her own father or mother." And so, it is written in Scripture for each one of us to take heed to (Matt.18:3) "Assuredly, I say to you, unless you are converted and become <u>as</u> <u>little children</u>, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven."

Therefore, when we begin to settle these matters with God (going to Him with our worry or need) and <u>not trust on 'self'</u> or <u>other people</u> or <u>plans and policies</u> as followed by those of a worldly (and carnal nature), the results will then be forthcoming as we are told in Scripture (Phil.4:6) "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God."

The apostle was inspired by the Holy Spirit of God, to give those instructions for <u>each one of</u> <u>us</u> to <u>heed</u> and <u>follow by faith</u>, and it is followed up with a Promise from God for us for doing so. So, if we will open our heart and mind up to God, and tell Him of our trouble or worry, what will be the result? Would we have a greater trouble to tell Him the next time? 'NO'. It would be thoroughly un-Scriptural to think that way, and it <u>would not</u> <u>be of God!</u> Instead, His Promise is given for us, (vs.7),"and the '<u>peace of God'</u>, which <u>surpasses</u> <u>all understanding</u>, will <u>guard</u> <u>your</u> <u>hearts</u> and <u>minds</u> through Christ Jesus." That would make it all worthwhile for us to tell all worry or trouble to <u>God alone</u>, <u>as His Word cannot</u> be <u>changed</u> <u>nor altered</u>.

We are <u>then</u> <u>given</u> <u>God's</u> <u>inspired</u> <u>instructions</u> on <u>how we are to conduct our life</u>, with 'self-life nature' taken away and gone from our heart, (vs.8) "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if *there is* any virtue and if *there is* anything praiseworthy--<u>meditate on</u> <u>these things</u>."

God will then follow up with His great rewards as promised for those who will take all things to Him in prayer. (Matt.11:28-30) "Come to me, all you toiling and burdened ones, and *I* will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For it is good to bear my yoke, and my burden is light."

"And I will give you rest", really means for us that God's Promised reward of His peace and rest will be ours to receive and enjoy, "and the <u>'peace of God'</u>, which <u>surpasses all</u> <u>understanding</u>, will <u>guard</u> <u>your</u> <u>hearts</u> and <u>minds</u> through Christ Jesus."

Surely, those Results of God's Promised Rewards, makes it all worthwhile in this life (for us to forsake the 'self-life nature'), and we are again reminded that 'self' absolutely must be removed from our heart so that we can bear fruit unto Eternal Life, as Jesus warned (John 12:24-26) "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat (the self-life) falls into the ground and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it /produces much grain. He who loves his life (puts the desires of a self-life ahead of God) will lose it, and he who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor." (To be honored by our 'Father in Heaven' is 'certainly something for us to think about', as it is quite a reward for us, for forsaking the human self-nature that was born in our heart, so that God can replace it with His own Nature. &&&&&&&&&&

Main Points of

Benefits of Surrendering Nature of Self-life

1.-- The 'seat of the self-life' began in the Garden of Eden, after mankind rebelled against God, and started out to depend on himself to manage and control his own life apart from God, depending on his own wisdom and strength. That remains a desperate situation today. 2.- All the troubles in the world up to this day were caused by 'self' in the hearts of people. As long as that fallen nature remains in our heart, we will never enter into the 'fullness of blessing' God provided and promised us in His Word, ...when we have a 'divine nature' instead of 'self-life' in our heart.

3.- Worry and anxiety is all part of the 'self-nature' within one's heart, and all of that must be turned over to God for Him to take care of all matters on our behalf. That is a vital part of 'self' and Satan will try to make it hard for us to forsake worry and anxiety, to keep us from entering into the fulfillment of God's Promises when we place all our matters and worries in God's hands. &&&&&&
